



To date, there are around **793 members**, included in 98 research teams mainly located in 20 cities in France and 8 other countries. SFDB members tackle developmental biology questions using a dozen animal, plant and algae models. **Thank you for your support to the society.**

We had 2 Board meetings in 2021, one on February 4th, 2021 in virtual format and the other on October 8th, 2021 in mixed format. The SFBD general assembly took place on December 8th, 2021 in virtual format.

PhD prize 2021

Responsible board members: Aude Maugarny-Calès and Andrea Pasini

In 2021, we awarded a thesis prize and a finalist prize, all sponsored by ZEISS. The thesis prize was awarded to **Alexandre CHUYEN** (IBDM, Marseille) for his work on the identification of a new mechanism controlling the organization of the multi-ciliated cells of the xenopus epidermis. Alexandre received a prize of 1000 Euros. The second prize (300 Euros) was awarded to **Aurélien VILLEDIEU** (Institut Curie, Paris) for his work highlighting a process of invagination and collective migration of epithelial cells during neck morphogenesis in *Drosophila*. The 2 winners were invited to give a conference during the Shaping Life2 meeting in April 2021 (video conference).






Supports for organizing events 2021

SFBD Meeting 2021 – Shaping Life2

The **Shaping Life2 meeting** (*initially scheduled for April 2020 in Cassis*) finally took place from April 7th to 9th, 2021 as a video conference. The meeting was co-organized with the IBMD, Marseille. The program included sessions on cross-cutting topics in developmental biology such as stem cells, organoids, mechanics and self-organization, environmental impact on development, evo-devo and emerging models as well as tools and technologies. Many places have been reserved for lectures given by researchers at the beginning of their careers. SFBD members have benefited from special reduced rates. 47 free registrations (boarding pass) have been allocated to doctoral and post-doctoral students who are members of the SFBD. Our SFBD thesis prizes gave oral presentations at this meeting. This meeting was a

success with more than 200 connections. The use of the *gathertown software* helped to optimize contacts between participants for the poster session and coffee breaks.

The SFBD and Federation of French Learned Societies

At the initiative of our former president, Patrick LEMAIRE, the learned societies have federated into a College of Academic Learned Societies of France, https://societes-savantes.fr/. This federation of learned societies was created on February 6th 2021. It aims to represent academia to politics and society through a single and powerful voice to raise public awareness of the essential contribution of research, scholarship and teaching to all of our lives. The SFBD is an active member of the federation.

The general assembly (GA) of the federation, initially scheduled for February 4th, 2022, has been postponed to 7th-8th April 2022. The purpose of this GA will be to establish priorities for the coming year, to establish a conference (with discussion time) on the theme of integrity and ethics, to modify the statutes, and to elect partial renewal of the Board.

The main actions of the federation in 2021 were

- Position statement in particular on the <u>organisation of an international conference on the</u> <u>attractivity of academic carrieres in Europe</u> in the form of an open letter published on January 15, 2022 (49 societies participated in this request).
- The establishment of two commissions,
- ° the school education commission (contact: louise.nyssen@umontpellier.fr) and
- ° the PhD commission (contact: dominique.valerian@yahoo.fr).
- *A call for nominations of female scientists* to be highlighted for the day international women's rights 2022. The SFBD Board proposed Virginie Courtier-Orgogozo (EcoEvoDevo, IJM, Paris)
- A call for applications for communication officers
- ° social media communication officers (mainly Twitter, maybe LinkedIn) with experience in using these tools.
- ° web manager in charge of defining the graphic charter of the federation, the specifications of the website to be built and its supply once the site has been created by a service provider (Wordpress database)

We will continue to support doctoral and post-doctoral students with calls to participate in international meetings. Due to the fluctuating but constant pandemic, we are also supporting online meetings in addition to face-to-face meetings with 4 successive calls in January, April, July and October 2022. In a spirit of sustainable development, we want to promote travel by train versus by plane when possible. We will allocate 500 Euros for train travel versus 400 Euros for air travel when the choice is possible.


Travel grants

Each year, the French Society of Developmental Biology (SFBD) awards around **10 travel grants to PhD students** (minimum 2nd year of PhD) or **young post-doctoral students** (less than 2 years of postdoc) members of the SFBD and willing to present their work at international conferences with a poster or an oral presentation.

The sanitary crisis has made the period unfavorable for travels over the past two years. However, meetings are resuming in face-to-face format, while some meetings are still held by videoconference with registration fees. We are opening a call for applications to participate in face-to-face or online conferences. We also give a bonus for eco-responsible travel avoiding flight transportation.

The **SFBD meeting 2022** will be held in **Strasbourg**, France, in partnership with the Japanese Society for Developmental Biology and the Human Frontier Science Programme (HFSP), with a face-to-face format (we hope) from November 7th to 10th, 2022.



The SFBD plans specific travel grants (mid-2022) for doctoral and post-doctoral students who are members of the SFBD in order to participate in this meeting.

NEW The Human Frontier Science Programme (HFSP) officially joins us as co-organisor of this meeting!!! We are looking forward to such fruitful collaboration and international opening!

This international conference aims to foster interactions between young researchers and leaders, to highlight young researchers and to forge long lasting ties with our Japanese colleagues. Franco-Japanese committee experiences ranging from the end of the PhD to young PIs is involved in crafting the programme, starting with the invited speakers line up, which includes several junior PIs. In addition, many opportunities for oral presentations selected on abstracts (36 selected talks plus many Poster flash talks) as well as two poster sessions will be proposed. We encourage students, postdoctoral fellows, staff members, and junior faculty using plant and animal models to present their work. The meeting is currently scheduled as a full in-person meeting.

Furthermore, one main ambition is to anchor this meeting in the society and reach out across civil society. It is thus planned as a double event, with a significant outreach component. This meeting will be associated with a range of outreach actions and several Art&Science events, such as an exhibit of art students' pieces mentored by scientists, and a video -mapping show. In addition, hands-on workshops are planned in schools the morning before the meeting: we hope many of you will volunteer to facilitate these events and brings science closer to school students!

Finally, looking for all possible sources of funding for the outreach activities, we received an original offer from the association Pourkoipâ, who produces theater plays. They will generously sponsor us by donating us half of the net gains of their latest play "Encore" that they will play on February 3rd in Strasbourg – please spread to word to all your Strasbourg friends so that the theater is full!!!



Membership for SFBD now operates on a rolling year basis, meaning that when you renew your membership on March 15th of one year, it is valid until March 14th of the following year.




Join us
